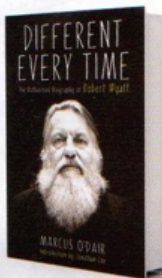

'Author and musician Marcus O'Dair tells the story of Robert Wyatt, famously the drummer and vocalist for 1960s psychedelic group Soft Machine, before becoming a singer and composer in his own right,' explains BBC Radio 4 producer Duncan Minshull. 'Wyatt's was a ruckus rock 'n' roll lifestyle until, fatefully, he fell from a window at a party, making him wheelchair-bound for the rest of his life. But he continued to make records. I admire his strength in adversity and his enduring need to write songs which means that the show goes on for Robert Wyatt, and it's all caught vividly by O'Dair. A compelling listen is in store.'
